All captains are to maintain a record of their own clubs first aid needs and provide all participants a suitable PFD in line with SCRA rules of racing.

Any specific first aid needs of participants should be highlighted to the race organizers before participation so that measure(s) can be in place.

Races will be held using Scottish Coastal Rowing Rules. Members of other associations should seek advice before submitting entry as to their eligibility to race.

Event Details

- **Times** - Coxes briefing is at 10:30 am on the west beach. Races begin around 1100 am (whenever there is water around the marks)
- **Safety boats** will not be present within the harbor whilst racing, The umpire

- on the pier will take full control of the area. Clubs must bring a VHF.
- **Refreshments** - Hot and cold snacks will be available throughout the day. You will find these being served on the west beach (unless weather is really bad, then these will be on the east beach).
 - **Parking** – Boats should be unloaded on the west beach and then trailers parked in the east car park
 - **Exemptions** – any clubs using the prototype oars under exemption from SCRA are requested to carry out two laps (one which complies with the current measurement rules and the prototype oars which do not). The time set using current measurement rules will be allocated to the team overall. The time set using the prototype oars can be obtained and used for comparison with a view towards the AGM vote at the end of the season. Clubs are encouraged to try this if practical.
 - **Open relay** – This will be **dependent on timings with the tide in the middle of the day and weather**. The race will start at Port Seton change crews in Cockenzie and race back. The crews will be made up from all different clubs. It will be held only in calm weather as to avoid any damage to skiffs in Cockenzie harbour.

4 of the crew will run to the old harbor from Port Seton, change over and then the first rowing crew will run back. The crew with all 9 (cox included) to the top of the beach will win.

Lanes will be drawn on the day.

Clubs are to provide a cox to their own boat.

No boat is allowed more than two members of one club at the same time. The crews will be allocated on the day from the race control.

Boats are expected to read the Rules of Racing and pay close attention to the turning rules around a single mark, these may be enforced:
